Lecture - GENIUS AND FRIENDS: A Grand Tour through the Bass Museum Salon of Western Art

In his presentation, Dr. Benjamin Binstock, Adjunct Curator of Renaissance and Baroque Art at the Bass Museum of Art, will introduce the new Taplin Gallery re-hanging of the Bass Museum's permanent collection.

Dr. Binstock will explore some of the highlights of the re-hung Taplin Gallery in the broader context of changing ways of looking at art and their significance for how we see ourselves, particularly our contemporary global, museological culture. The new Taplin Gallery is partly modeled on the densely hung nineteenth-century Paris Salon, and reflects the diverse national traditions of the eighteenth-century aristocratic "Grand Tour" of Europe, in a smaller, more manageable form. Dr. Binstock's Grand Tour will emphasize the genius of the outstanding artists who redefined their eras and their impact on their peers, as well as connections between the Bass Museum's rich collection and his own current research projects.
