Road work will cause delays on the Julia Tuttle Causeway

On Sunday, July 12, 2009, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Six, will begin a Roadway Enhancement Project along the Julia Tuttle Causeway (State Road (S.R.) 112 / Interstate (I) 195) from Biscayne Waterway to Alton Road. Construction is expected to last approximately six months and cost an estimated \$2.8 million. Please note that this schedule is tentative and subject to change due to weather and/or other unforeseen circumstances.

The intent of the project is to enhance the area by: repaving and re-striping the roadway; installing overhead sign structures; and resetting existing guardrail.

In order to perform this work safely, it will be necessary to close travel lanes at various times and locations. However, at least one travel lane will remain open in each direction and pedestrian access will be maintained on one side of the roadway at all times. Construction will occur during non-event days, nights and weekends, and will be phased to minimize construction-related impacts. The department will implement a detailed Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) plan to maintain traffic flow during construction and project personnel will make every effort to minimize impacts while this project is underway. As part of our commitment to inform the public about projects that will benefit their community, the department has placed information regarding lane closures and the scope of work of this project on our web site, www.fdotmiamidade.com. Also, signs will be installed within the project limits which provide our web site address and phone number so that motorists may contact us if they have questions and/or concerns.
